Noida: On a day dominated by the foreign contingent, Tapendra Ghai saved the day for India in the top category ('A'), his card of level-par 72 one shot better than Feroz Garewal and three ahead of Manu Gandas, giving hosts a good start at the 4th Albatross International Junior Golf Championship that got under way here on Wednesday.

US calling for young golfers

New Delhi: With Albatross International Junior tying up with Junior Golf Scoreboard (USA) points system, young golfers playing in the 4th Albatross International Junior Golf Championship to be played at Jaypee Greens Golf resort in Greater Noida from November 20th to 23rd, will stand a chance to get scholarships in one of the colleges or universities in the US. At the moment, there are close to 6000 players being ranked through this system from over 1000 tournaments around the world. This is another first for Albatross Junior Golf Tour which is co-sanctioned by Hank Haney International Junior Golf Academy (US).
